

EASTER MESSAGE

"Why look among the dead for someone who is alive".

Fr. Dan and I wish all of Our Parishioners a very happy holy Easter, and every blessing of this sacred hopefilled season, as we rejoice in the Risen Christ.

I have had so many memorable Easters in this community serving the people of Drimnagh and this will be my last, as the Archbishop has asked me to take up a new posting. It has been my privilege and joy to be part of such a unique special community. Though there is a modicum of saddness leaving, my overwhelming feeling is one of gratitude, for your kindness, support, and care towards me over the last 14 years.

In some ways with the ongoing situation in Gaza, Ukraine, Israel, and regions where war has torn communities apart, should we even be celebrating Easter, when so many of our brothers and sisters are in distress.

Of course we should. Christians are called to be born optimists. Where as the world deals in facts, we are called to deal in faith. Once more a huge thank you to everyone and a very Happy Easter to all our people.








Every Thursday

Palm Sunday 24th March

Procession with Blessed Palms.
Holy Week begins on Palm or Passion
Sunday. It celebrates the triumphal entry
of Christ into Jerusalem while the people
cried Hosanna. We will bless and
distribute Palms and invite you to take a
small piece to your home to signify that
Christ is a welcome guest there.

Holy Thursday 28th March



10.00am Morning Prayer

10.30am Mass of Chrism, Pro-Cathedral at which our Parish will be represented by Pat Conway and Mary Burke 7.30pm Solemn Celebration of the Lord's

Supper, *Procession to the Altar of Repose* followed by 'Watch and pray' for an hour.

On this day the Lord instituted the Priesthood and the Blessed Eucharist. His command is "Do this in memory of me." At the Last Supper he shocked his disciples by doing the job of a servant - washing their feet - and in so doing left an example of love that he invites his disciples to imitate. At the end of our Solemn celebration, with which we begin the Easter Triduum, we carry the Blessed Sacrament through the church in procession, to the Altar of Repose remembering Jesus in the garden of Gethsemane.



Good Friday 29th March

Mass is not celebrated today.
10.00am Morning Prayer
12.00noon Children's/Family Stations of the Cross
3.00pm Solemn Celebration of the Lord's Passion
8.00pm Taize Prayer around the cross.

What a strange name for such an awful day. Today we journey with Christ on the way of the Cross, a path of suffering and of pain that leads him to the hill of Calvary and death.

How it must have broken his mother's heart to see her Son abused and tortured, jeered at and slapped and finally nailed to a cross. His disciples ran away, and who could blame them, they were in fear of their lives. Today we can sit at the foot of his cross and grieve for our own sins, the sins he took upon himself for our salvation.


Holy Saturday 30th March

Mass of the Easter Vigil 9.00pm.






Easter Vigil
